What is this Bible Book Club all about?

A couple of weeks ago I introduced the Living Our Faith - Bible Book Club. This is an invitation from ELCIC National Bishop Susan Johnson to engage in a year of reading the bible. So far, there have been eight folks who have 'officially' let me know they are excited to participate. Maybe you have chosen to participate on your own or with your bubble of people. That is terrific!

And knowing we join with our siblings in Christ from coast to coast to coast, reading and discussing the 'book' of the month, well, there's something holy about that.

October's book is Deuteronomy.

The book of Deuteronomy takes the form of a series of speeches given by Moses to the people of Israel. He speaks just before the conquest of the promised land of Canaan. Faithful scribes and priests wrote the core of this book around 700-640 B.C.E. (Before Christian Era) At that time the power of Assyria was causing a crisis of Fatih in Judah. The authors of Deuteronomy wanted the people to stay faithful to God. A shorter form of this book was found during repairs on the temple in the time of King Josiah (640-609 B.C.E.) Josiah then put the lows of Deuteronomy into effect (see Kgs 22-23)

The book of Deuteronomy is a timeless theological book, meaning it tells us about God and God's relationship with us and the world. We overhear Moses making Gd's law known to God's people before the conquest of the promised land. He wants to convince them to obey that law after they have entered the land.

Above is a sampling of the background information to help understand these ancient writings! So if you've never set a goal to read the bible ... why not do it now? If ever there was a time for us to sink our souls into God's Word, it's now!
